1. Introduction

The IIM Indore Alumni Association invites applications from eligible alumni for the positions of City/Region Head and Deputy City/Region across eleven City/Regional Alumni Chapters. This is a foundational moment for the alumni network — the inaugural leaders of these chapters will collectively constitute the Global Executive Committee (GEC) of the alumni network.

The selection will be made through an Expression of Interest and interview-based process.

2. Chapters Open for Application

Applications are invited for the positions of City/Region Head and Deputy City/Region Head for each of the following eleven chapters:

1.	Americas	2.	Bengaluru
3.	Central India	4.	Chennai
5.	Delhi and NCR	6.	Hyderabad

3. Role of the City/Region Head

The City/Region Head is the principal representative and leader of the alumni chapter within the designated geography. Key responsibilities include:

- a. Providing strategic leadership and direction for alumni engagement initiatives within the region.
- b. Representing the respective chapter in the Global Executive Committee (GEC) of the alumni network.
- c. Leading the planning, coordination, and execution of alumni outreach programmes, networking forums, professional engagements, and outreach initiatives.
- d. Maintaining regular coordination with the Alumni Office, Student Alumni Committee, GEC and the Board of the Alumni Association on chapter activities.
- e. Encouraging active participation and collaboration among alumni residing in the region.
- f. Upholding governance standards and ensuring that chapter activities are conducted in accordance with the policies and guidelines of the Alumni Association and the Institute.
- g. Mobilising alumni participation in institutional initiatives such as mentoring, accreditation and career services outreach, industry engagement, knowledge sharing, and fundraising activities, where appropriate.
- h. Drive regional contributions to the Alumni Endowment Fund by fostering a culture of giving and organizing dedicated fundraising campaigns among the local alumni base.

4. Role of the Deputy City/Region Head

The Deputy City/Region Head shall assist the City/Region Head and ensure operational continuity of the chapter. The responsibilities shall include:

- a. Supporting the City/Region Head in planning and implementing alumni engagement activities.
- b. Assisting in the coordination and supervision of committee activities.
- c. Facilitating operational management of events, communication, and outreach activities.
- d. Acting on behalf of the City/Region Head, as and when required.
- e. Ensuring leadership continuity and assuming the role of City/Region Head in the absence of the City/Region Head.

5. Role of the Committee Members

Committee Members shall support the leadership team in implementing chapter activities and programmes. In order to ensure adequate gender representation, a minimum of two (2) women members shall be included within the five-member (5) committee.

Their responsibilities shall include:

- a. Assisting in the planning and execution of alumni networking events and professional engagements.
- b. Supporting initiatives relating to sponsorship outreach, partnerships, and resource mobilisation.
- c. Assisting with communication, publicity, and promotion of alumni activities within the region.
- d. Supporting data coordination and updating of alumni information in consultation with the Alumni Office, Student Alumni Committee and Alumni Association.
- e. Contributing to initiatives that promote alumni welfare, mentorship programmes, and institutional engagement.
- f. Undertaking specific functional responsibilities such as event management, finance coordination, media outreach, or alumni engagement activities, as may be assigned by the City/Region Head.

6. Eligibility Criteria

The eligibility criteria for various positions are as follows:

City/Region Head

The candidate shall possess a minimum of seven (7) years of professional or entrepreneurial experience after graduating from the Institute.

Deputy City/Region Head

The candidate shall possess a minimum of five (5) years of professional or entrepreneurial experience after graduating from the Institute.

Committee Members

- a. Fresh graduates of the Institute shall be eligible to apply for the position of Committee Member.
- b. The preference may be given to candidates who have served for at least one year as Junior or Senior Club/Committee Members during their programme at the Institute.
- c. Such experience may also be considered while assessing eligibility for the positions of City/Region Head and Deputy City/Region Head, and may be taken into account while evaluating leadership experience.
- d. The committee members with at least three years of cumulative experience within any established city or region are eligible to apply for City/Region Head or Deputy Head positions.

Selection of Committee Members

The City/Region Head shall be responsible for selecting the five Committee Members who will assist in the functioning of the respective City/Regional Chapter. The committee members must be registered members of the Vaave Alumni Portal (now renamed to Hoopstr) and the IIM Indore Alumni Association.

While constituting the committee, the City/Region Head shall endeavour to ensure diversity in terms of programme representation, batch cohorts, professional backgrounds, and gender representation.

7. Tenure and Succession Mechanism

The tenure of the City/Region Head and Deputy City/Region Head shall be two (2) years.

Upon premature exit/transfer of City/Region Head to any other geography, the Deputy City/Region Head shall automatically assume the role of City/Region Head, thereby ensuring continuity of leadership.

The newly appointed City/Region Head shall nominate one member from the existing five-member committee to serve as Deputy City/Region Head for the subsequent term.

8. Application Process

Step 1 — Submit Expression of Interest

Applicants must submit the following to the Alumni Association Office via [Google Form](#) by 15 June 2026:

a. Candidates contesting for the position of City/Region Head shall submit the EOI via above-referred Google Form and upload a five-minute video presentation outlining their vision, roadmap, and proposed initiatives for strengthening alumni engagement.

Step 2 — Obtain Recommendations

Each applicant must arrange for at least five (5) alumni from their chapter's geography to submit recommendations directly to the Alumni Association Office via [Google Form](#) by 15 June 2026. Recommendations must be submitted by the recommending alumni independently, not via the applicant.

Each recommendation shall clearly specify:

- i. Name of the nominee
- ii. Reasons for the recommendation

Both the nominee and the recommending alumni must be registered members of the Vaave Alumni Portal and the IIM Indore Alumni Association.

Step 3 — Background Verification

The Alumni Office will undertake background verification of all shortlisted candidates in coordination with the Programme Offices, Hostel Office, and Office of Student Affairs.

Step 4 — Interview

Shortlisted candidates will be invited to an interview with a panel comprising senior alumni and faculty of the Institute.

Each candidate will deliver a five-minute presentation outlining their vision and roadmap, followed by a discussion with the panel. Interviews will be conducted online. Dates will be announced in due course of time.

9. Important Notes

- An alumnus may apply for only one chapter.
- The Board of the IIM Indore Alumni Association retains the right to reject any application or remove any individual from the position of City/Region Head, Deputy City/Region Head, or Committee Member, with reasons recorded.
- The Board serves as the Appellate Authority for any disputes or grievances.
- Incomplete applications or those received after the deadline will not be considered for further processing.
